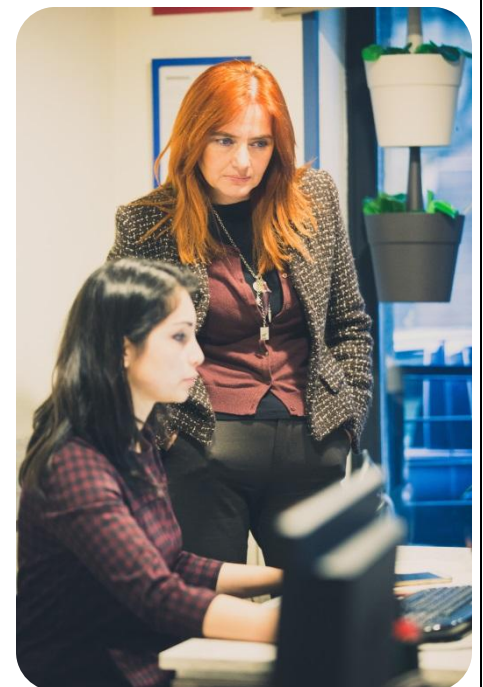
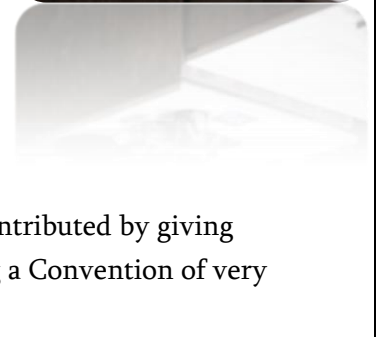
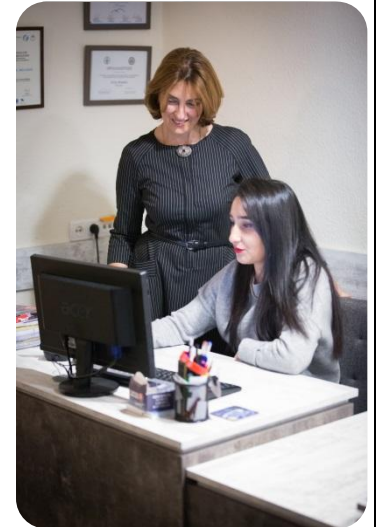
the Georgian
